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


Vocational education and training is more important than ever. Providing people with the skills they need and that help them find a quality job, is one of our central responses to the recover, and key for the green and digital transitions.




EU Support for Centres of Vocational Excellence

- 20 ongoing projects, and 13 more to be announced in February 2023




Erasmus+ funding for the CoVE initiative 2019-2027(estimated)






Centres of Vocational Excellence: Selected projects




Erasmus+ 2020 pilot call (4 years duration)


CoVE Erasmus+ call 2022: Countries of participating organisations



Capacity of the initiative for the Internationalization of VET attracting partners from all over the world




CoVE Erasmus+ call 2022: **Type** of participating organisations

The Erasmus+ Call 2023: **Novelties** compared to 2022 (I)

The project must include relevant deliverables linked to the following three clusters:

- at least 3 of the activities listed in the Application Form under Cluster 1 Teaching and learning,
- at least 3 of the activities listed in the Application Form under Cluster 2 Cooperation and partnership, and
- at least 2 of the activities listed in the Application Form under Cluster 3 Governance and funding.

Cluster 1 - Teaching and learning

- i. Providing people with labour market relevant skills including those necessary for the green and digital transitions¹⁵², in a lifelong learning and inclusive¹⁵³ approach providing learning opportunities to people of all ages and socio-economic backgrounds¹⁵⁴. Combining offers of initial VET qualifications, with offers of continuing training for upskilling and reskilling (including micro-credentials), that are informed by skills intelligence¹⁵⁵.
- The overall number of activities
- The presentation of activities
- The **minimum number** of activities under each cluster
- The requirement to **explain the choice of activities** and describe how they contribute to the goals

The project must chose relevant activities (providing details on the concrete actions and deliverables) indicated under the following three clusters:


- > at least 4 of the activities listed in the Application Form under Cluster 1 Teaching and learning,
- > at least 3 of the activities listed in the Application Form under Cluster 2 Cooperation and partnership, and
- > at least 2 of the activities listed in the Application Form under Cluster 3 Governance and funding.


Cluster 1 - Teaching and learning

- . Providing people with labour market relevant skills
 - By anticipating future skill needs using effective means to rapidly identify changing labour market needs¹⁷⁹, and matching skill provision with job opportunities
 - By focusing both on technical skills and key competences¹⁸⁰
 - By including the skills necessary for the green and digital transitions¹⁸¹

The project must clearly identify and explain the choice of each of the selected activities, and describe how the work to be carried out through those activities will concretely contribute to the relevant work packages, and with the overall objectives of the project.







The Erasmus+ Call 2023: **Novelties** compared to 2022 (II)

Seal of Excellence

The project proposals evaluated above the quality thresholds, with a total score **equal to or higher than 75%**, but that cannot be funded under Erasmus+ due to lack of available budget under this call for proposals, may be awarded with a **Seal of Excellence** certificate to attest the quality of the proposal and to facilitate its alternative funding at national or regional level.

New

The Seal of Excellence is a quality label certificate awarded to quality project proposals that cannot be funded under Erasmus+ due to insufficient funds²²⁹. The label recognises the quality of the proposal and facilitates the search for alternative funding. Funding bodies at national or regional level may decide to directly fund the Seal holder project proposal on the basis of the high quality evaluation process performed by the Commission's independent experts, without performing a new full evaluation process. The award of the Seal of Excellence may also facilitate the alternative funding from the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF) or the European Social Fund Plus (ESF+), in accordance with Article 73(4) of the Common Provisions Regulation (CPR)²³⁰.
