Funding rules - differences between Lot 1 & Lot 2

Eligibility Criteria: Who can apply?

- Provided that they are **partners in large-scale skills partnerships under the Pact for Skills**, the organizations listed in the eligibility criteria (HE, VET, SMEs.....) can be involved as **applicants (coordinator and full partners) or associated partners**
- They can be **public or private organisations** legally established in an **EU Member State or third country associated to the programme**
- **The coordinator must be coordinating an ecosystem-based large-scale skills partnership under the Pact for Skills**
- **Higher education institutions established in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme must hold a valid Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE)**

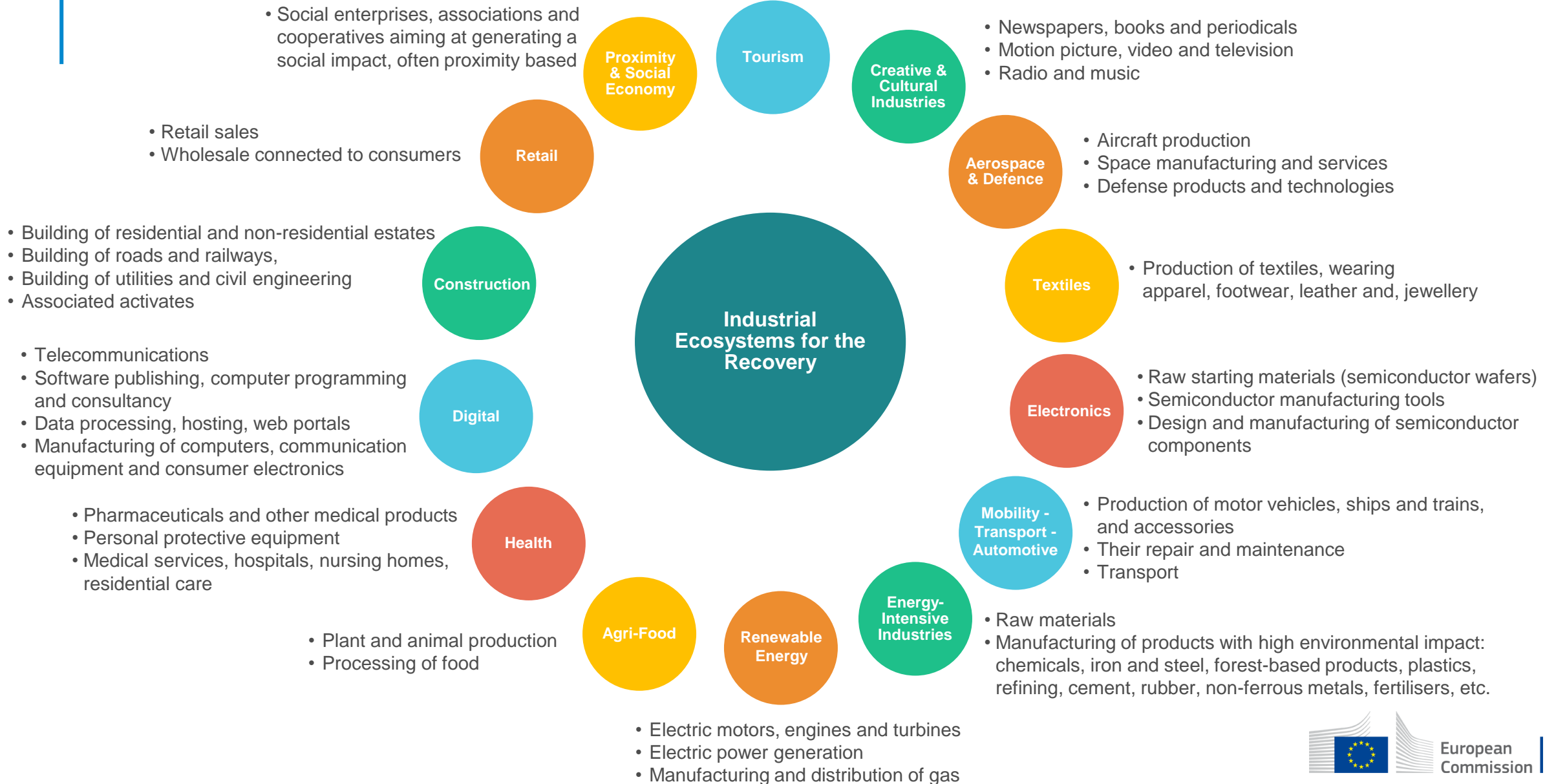

1) Relevance

- Relevance in terms of link to EU policy and initiatives – relevant for the chosen ecosystem
- Purpose – relevant for emerging occupational profiles
- Consistency
- Sector/area representation
- Digital and key-enabling technologies
- Green skills
- Innovation
- European added value
- Education & training representation



2) Quality of the project design and implementation

- Coherence: Consistency between activities and results
- Structure: Quality of the work programme (and its phasing)
- Methodology: use of the EU tools and skills when relevant
- Management
- Work Plan
- Quality of arrangements for the recognition and validation of qualifications
- **Budget:** Cost-effectiveness and allocation of appropriate resources – attention in case the proposal is an ecosystem in which a Blueprint is already ongoing
- Financial and Quality control: measures to ensure that the project implementation is of high quality



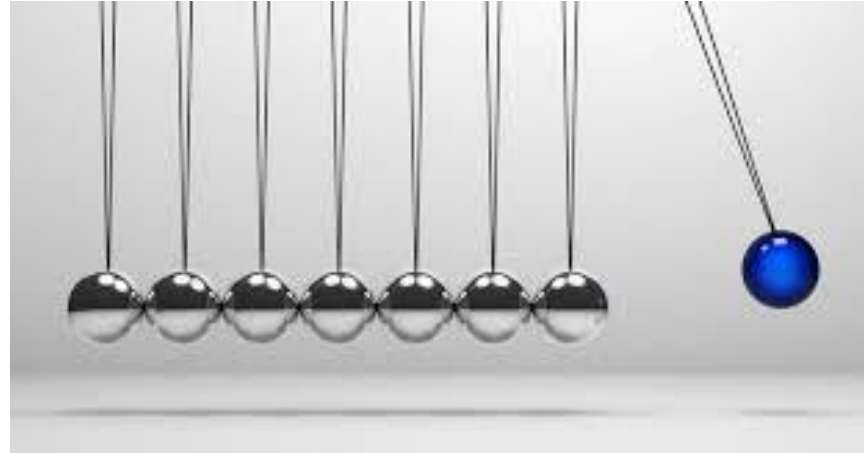
3) Quality of the partnership and the cooperation arrangements

- **Configuration**: the partnership is composed of partners of large-scale skills partnerships under the Pact for Skills
- Commitment: complementary contributions
- Tasks
- Collaboration/Team spirit
- Reward

Evaluation timeline

3 May 2023 – 17.00 CET	Submission deadline

- **Fill in** – an application having next to you the **Programme guide**
- **Answer** - to **all points** listed **under each Award criterion**
- **Pay attention** – expect **impact** has a specific section in the Programme Guide
