Priority 7: supporting the Pact for Skills

- **Purpose**: Supporting partnerships that have joined the Pact for Skills with actions including but not limited to:
 - Development of governance structures or arrangements connecting members
 - Definition, implementation & monitoring of the concrete commitments
- Who can apply: Specific eligibility criteria. Only organisations that have signed the Pact as partnerships (in the application form).



Activities for this priority

Projects will implement <u>all</u> these activities:

- Develop & support governance structures or arrangements connecting members within the same Pact for Skills partnership;
- Develop & support cooperation of big companies with SMEs, and among SMEs, that are members of the same Pact for Skills partnership in the field of training;
- Support the definition, implementation & monitoring of the concrete commitments of the Pact for Skills partnership, such as:
 - gathering skills intelligence,
 - upskilling of low-skilled people,
 - reskilling people for new tasks in their jobs, reskilling of people from other sectors
 with skills transferable to the own sector, with a particular view on integrating
 refugees from Ukraine into the labour market.

Specific aspect to be assessed

Specific aspect to be assessed as part of the award criteria for "Priority 7 – Supporting the Pact for Skills":

For the scope of the projects, "the extent to which the proposal envisages actions that will reinforce cooperation among partners resulting in better skills intelligence and effective upskilling and reskilling of workers" will be assessed.

As a reminder:

- scope is part of the assessment for Relevance of the Project
- Along with Relevance, the award criteria include: Quality of the project design and implementation; Quality of the partnership and the cooperation arrangements and Impact, dissemination and sustainability.

Specific eligibility criteria

- The coordinator of the proposal must be a coordinating organisation of a Pact for Skills partnership, and
- only organisations in existing Pact for Skills partnerships can be full partners.
- At the submission deadline!
- Other organisations can be associated to the proposal (not as 'applicants')
- Not all members of the partnership need to be part of the consortium.
- Consortium composition:
 - Minimum 3 partners (1 applicant + 2 partners)
 - from a minimum of 3 different countries



Project

- Grant per project: maximum 1Mio €.
- Level of co-funding: 80%.
- Duration: 24 months.
- Timeline:
 - Submission deadline: 15 March 2023 17.00 CET
 - Selection results communicated to applicants: August 2023.
 - Project start dates: End of 2023 beginning of 2024.
