



Specific objectives Call TT 2025

To promote **exchanges between citizens of different countries**

To encourage **cooperation between municipalities and the exchange of best practices**

To guarantee **peaceful relations between Europeans and to ensure their active participation at the local level**

To reinforce **mutual understanding and friendship**

To discover **the cultural diversity of the European Union**

To give **citizens practical experience of the wealth and diversity of the common heritage of the Union and to make them aware that these constitute the foundation for a common future**

To support **good local governance and reinforce the role of local and regional authorities in the European integration process**

Call Town Twinning 2025 – Priorities & Themes

- Fostering **solidarity** between EU citizens, across borders, in and beyond the EU through mutual understanding and the creation of fora to discuss common solutions in a constructive way.
- Raising awareness of the importance of **reinforcing the European integration process based on solidarity and EU values**

- Raising awareness on the **richness of the cultural and linguistic environment in Europe**
- Improve **citizens' democratic participation** through cultural activities, including by drawing inspiration from the **New European Bauhaus** initiative on reimagining sustainable living

- Promoting awareness and knowledge of **EU citizenship rights, free movement of people and European values and democratic standards**
- Preventing and raising awareness **on domestic violence and violence against children, including (cyber-) bullying and harassment**

- Promoting **debate on the Europe that citizens want** so that people have a sense of belonging to Europe and better understand the benefits of the EU while reinforcing social and political cohesion.
- Promoting **participation in democratic processes and decision-making**, including children

Town Twinning CALL 2024 - OVERVIEW


- **Number of proposals submitted : 392**
- **Award of grant to 110 proposals** for the amount of EUR 3.998.110 €

Out of **392 proposals received**

Success rate ≈ 30 %

- All proposals assessed by external experts

Overview of 2025 Town Twinning Submission data

Town Twinning CALL 2025 – Submission data

- Call Publication: **19 February 2025**
- Call opening: **09 April 2025**
- Call deadline: **Check the EU F&TP**
- Evaluation period: **Sept 2025 – March 2026**
- Information on evaluation results: **March 2026**
- GA Signature: **by mid-June 2026**
- Available Budget **EUR 5 000 000 €**
- **Translations available in 23 languages:** [Call for proposals Town Twinning \(CERV-2025-CITIZENS-TOWN-TT\) | European Education and Culture Executive Agency](#)



Eligibility - Applicants

- Legal entities (public or private bodies) from [eligible countries](#)
- Eligible countries (EU MS – eligibility subject to signed association agreements) - [list-3rd-country-participation cerv en.pdf](#)
- Public bodies or non-profit organisations: eligible if representing local authorities (a letter of support signed by a Municipality)
- Submitted by a single applicant, which should be registered in the Participant Register (PIC)



Eligibility - Other conditions

- Municipalities or other level of local authorities of **at least two eligible countries** (coordinator + at least 1 associated partner)
- Number of participants: **minimum of 50 participants** in the Town-Twinning events, of which **25 are invited international participants**
- Geographical location: **activities in eligible countries**
- Duration of the project: from **6 to 12 months**
- **Projects must comply with ethics and EU values**

Award criteria and evaluation process

Award criteria	Minimum pass score	Maximum score
Relevance	25	40
Quality — Project design and implementation	n/a	40
Impact	n/a	20
Overall (pass) scores	70	100

- Maximum points: 100 points
- Individual threshold for the criterion 'Relevance': 25/40 points.
- Overall threshold: 70 points.
- Proposals that pass the individual threshold for the criterion 'Relevance' AND the overall threshold will be considered for funding — within the limits of the available call budget.



What is a successful proposal?

- **Impactful:** concrete targets and results
- **Realistic** objectives
- **Originality** (a new angle)
- **Innovation**
- **A variety of countries** (min 2 while more is desired for a more positive assessment)
- **Build on existing goodpractice :**
concrete multiplier effect (partner search via formerly supported projects)



CALL 2025 – what is new?

- **Increased budget** (min 4 000 000 EUR / max 5 000 000 EUR)
- **Revised Calculator - clear template**

EU contribution to the project budget remains between EUR 8.455 and EUR 50.745 per project

- **As in 2024, one single WP for one or more events** (for more flexibility)
- **1 WP = one or more events = one or more deliverables**

What is it needed?

- Application Form Part A
- Application Form Part B
- The KPI Tool (to be filled in directly online)

Mandatory annexes and supporting documents:

- lump sum calculator
- letter of support signed by the Municipality
- list of previous projects
- for all participants implementing activities involving children:
 - for public bodies - **child protection policy declaration**
 - and** private bodies - copy of their policy;

Proposals are limited to maximum **40 pages** (Part B)



Why you should pay specific attention to gender mainstreaming in your proposal

- Attention to gender mainstreaming has an impact on the score you receive in the evaluation.
- Integrating a gender perspective in the design and implementation of your project increases the quality of your proposal

How to make sure you integrate a gender perspective?

Basic

• Did I conduct a **gender equality analysis** to assess my project's design, implementation and impact?

Basic

• Did I take into account **gender aspects in my needs assessment**?

Basic

• Will the data and indicators I collect and create be **disaggregated by sex**?

Basic

• Did I include in my proposal a **commitment to advance gender equality**?

Basic

• Did I include in my proposal a **commitment to monitor and report on the gender equality results achieved** by the project in the evaluation phase?

Advance

• Do I plan to create **gender-specific indicators** to measure the project's gender equality objectives?

Adherence to EU values in CERV

“Outline measures to be taken and the policies in place to guarantee full compliance with the EU values mentioned in Article 2 of the Treaty on the European Union and Article 21 of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights”

Art.2 Treaty on European Union (EU values)

The Union is founded on the values of respect for human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law and respect for human rights, including the rights of persons belonging to minorities. These values are common to the Member States in a society in which pluralism, non-discrimination, tolerance, justice, solidarity and equality between women and men prevail.

Art.21 Charter of Fundamental Rights (Non-discrimination)

Any discrimination based on any ground such as sex, race, color, ethnic or social origin, genetic features, language, religion or belief, political or any other opinion, membership of a national minority, property, birth, disability, age or sexual orientation shall be prohibited.

Within the scope of application of the Treaties and without prejudice to any of their specific provisions, any discrimination on grounds of nationality shall be prohibited.







Tips and tricks



- **First of all : DON'T PANIC**, we are here to help you 😊
- **Read** carefully the Call!
- Focus on **eligibility criteria** and **mandatory documentation** (e.g. eligible countries, letter of support, calculation etc.)
- Projects in **scope**: choose at least one specific priority
- Integrate in the proposal the **gender** mainstreaming and/or the **child** protection perspective if the activities involve minors
- Declare that your proposal is **EU Values** compliant.

Tips and tricks




- Set **realistic** objectives . Don't be overambitious
- Set **concrete targets and results** , which can have an **impact** at local and larger level
- **Clear writing** in the application form
- Set a good **collaboration** among partners/ identify clearly the **activities** to be done in advance
- **Communicate!**
- Don't wait until last moment to submit
- Something not clear? **contact EACEA TT team**; check the **FAQ** section in the portal and contact the **NCP in your country**; you can get support in your own language



Communication & Dissemination

Communication, Dissemination and Visibility

- Communication and dissemination activities **impact the score** you receive in the assessment
- What are the **communication channels** identified? Are they accessible to the general audience, in particular to people from marginalized groups?
- Is the action likely to produce a positive multiplier effect?
- Is the project linked to EU policies ? (for ex 2025 = European Year of Digital Citizenship Education)



Communication, Dissemination and Visibility

➤ Do the activities meet points such as:

- ...contributing to the promotion of gender equality and non-discrimination?
- ...ensure the visibility of the EU funding ?




