### Tips for applicants

- Pay attention to the **eligibility criteria** in the Programme Guide: often, they have changed compared to the past, and they might change again!
- Pay attention to the **specificities of the action (or the strand)** in terms of objectives and activities to be implemented. Show the evaluators that you meet the objectives of the actions or strand for which you apply. And remember, proposals must address real needs!
- Application forms are articulated between Work Packages, Tasks, Milestones, Deliverables and Budget: this requires coherence and details. Coherence across the description of all parts of your proposal is essential!
- There is a **totally new system for the submission of proposals (FTOP= Funding and Tender Opportunities Portal).** Get familiar with it as soon as possible!
- Be selective with the number of proposals that you submit. Do not multiply the efforts by preparing or participating in many proposals, but rather focus on specific proposals with proofed institutional support and that reflect an institutional or national strategy!

#### What is the International credit mobility (ICM)?

- Short-term higher education mobility for students, academic and administrative staff
- All levels: Bachelor, Master and PhD candidates and in any subject or academic discipline
- Study periods and traineeships of 2 12 months
- Grants to cover travel and living costs
- Decentralised management National Agencies in the 27 MS + 6 associated countries



#### How does it work?

- **Decentralised action** managed by the Erasmus+ National Agencies based in the programme countries
- **Global action**: the world is divided into regions, which have different budgets allocated per year




#### ICM budget

#### Activities supported (I)

- Short-term higher education mobility for students, academic and administrative staff
- All levels: Bachelor, Master and PhD candidates
- Mobility in any subject or academic discipline
- Also supports traineeships for students and training for staff
- Study periods and traineeships of 2 12 months
- Blended mobility (physical mobility of 5 30 days + virtual component)



#### Activities supported (II)

- All partners in an ICM project can send and host students and staff as described in their submitted project and provided that a relevant grant has been secured.
- For certain countries, Bachelor/Master student mobility is only possible from third countries to Europe – this means third country universities can send but not host.

- European partners may use a part of their **intra-European mobility budget** to fund their students mobility to restricted countries under ICM.





#### **Organisational support**

EUR 500/participant

#### Individual support

EUR 700-900/month for students and EUR 140-180/day for staff

EUR 79/day up to the 14th day of activity and EUR 56/day from 15th to the 30th day of activity in case of blended mobility


#### **Contribution to travel costs**

EUR 20-1500, depending on distance travelled



#### Who can apply and how? (I)


- Higher Education Institutions in the Programme countries
- The **ICM project in their application** contains the countries and partner universities they intend to cooperate with, as well as their **cooperation plan in each region**






#### Who can apply and how? (II)

- Upon successfully passing the established quality criteria, they will be allocated an ICM grant spread in different regional envelopes
- For every partnership with a secured budget, an **Inter-Institutional Agreement** is needed between the main applicant in Europe and every partner university in third countries before mobilities can start.

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### International opening of KA131 (since 2021)

- Application:
  - KA131: only indicative % for international mobility (max. 20%)
  - KA171: quality assessment per region & approval of country flows
- Implementation mode:
  - KA131: selection of partner countries & HEIs during implementation
  - KA171: approval of partner countries and HEIs during application
- Geographical scope and flows:
  - KA131: worldwide, only outgoing mobility
  - KA171: worldwide except Regions 13 and 14, geographical targets
- Complementarity between the two strands



# Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters (EMJM)

- ✓ A high-level integrated & transnational study programme at MA level
- ✓ A Master programme of excellence open to all disciplines
- Joint diploma delivered by an international partnership of HEIs from different countries worldwide & other educational and/or non educational partners
- ✓ Studies take place in at least 2 different European countries.
- Offering high-level scholarships to excellent students worldwide
- Institutions from all over the world may submit a proposal
- Erasmus Mundus Design Measures: New projects to launch the basis for a joint programme



### EMJM – main objectives

- Support quality, innovation, excellence, internationalisation of HEIs through academic cooperation within the EHEA and beyond
- ✓ Increase quality and attractiveness of the EHEA
- Support EU External Action in higher education
- ✓ Increase synergies between HE, innovation and research
- Improve competences, skills, employability of Master graduates
- Respond to societal and labour market needs



### EMJM – main requirements (1)

- a jointly designed fully integrated curriculum and common implementation procedures based on the Standards for Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes in the EHEA (e.g. joint selection, promotion, common services, joint administrative and financial management, etc.)
- be delivered by a consortium of at least three HEIs from three different countries of which at least two must be EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme
- international outreach to attract and enrol excellent students worldwide (part of which may benefit from an EMJM scholarship)



### EMJM – main requirements (2)

- compulsory physical mobility for all enrolled students at least 2 study periods in two countries with a minimum duration of one academic semester each (different from the country of residence of students)
- contribution of scholars/guest lecturers to teaching, training and research activities
- delivery of a **joint degree or multiple degrees** (joint degrees are highly recommended where national legislation allows it)



At application stage EMJM proposals must present fully developed joint study programmes, ready to run and to be advertised worldwide after their selection.



### EMJM Set-up (1)

- Fixed Grant Agreement of 74 months independently from the length of the master
- Commitment to enrol a certain number of students per project
- At least 4 master editions lasting 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90 or 120 ECTS)
- Start of the 1st edition no later than the academic year following the year of project selection
- At least 2 study periods in 2 countries (of which at least one in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme and both different from the country of residence of students)
- Geographical balance of students: no more than 10% of total scholarships per project awarded to students of the same nationality (does not apply to additional scholarships for targeted regions)





### Taking part as an Organisation



- Open to any public or private organisation established in an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme or third country not associated to the Programme
- Applications can be submitted by any eligible HEI from an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme or third country not associated to the Programme
- HEIs in EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme: valid ECHE
- HEIs in third countries not associated to the Programme: should commit to ECHE principles in the Partnership Agreement
- ✓ HEIs from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme: completed accreditation/evaluation of the master programme



Minimum consortium: **3 HEIs from 3 different countries** of which at least 2 must be an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme


Implementation costs of the study programme

> unit cost per enrolled student of 750€ /month
How to calculate: € 750 x n° of months x n° of enrolled students (cap of 100 enrolled students – but consortia are welcome to commit for higher numbers)
=> max. amount per project: 1.800.000 €

Same unit cost for scholarship holders and non-scholarship holders

Same unit cost for students from EU Member States, third countries associated to the Programme and third countries not associated to the Programme

## Start with an Erasmus Mundus Design Measure and launch the basis for a joint programme



### Rationale behind EMDM lot

- Filling the gap of the Erasmus Mundus Action by supporting the development of new joint master programmes
- Diversify the offer of Joint Master Programmes and encourage new academic cooperation by involving Erasmus Mundus under-represented EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme, and/or institutions from these countries, and/or thematic areas



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- Filling the gap of the Erasmus Mundus Action by supporting the development of new joint master programmes
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### What is an EMDM project?



- Short duration grant to support institutions in the set-up of a new joint master programme in Europe (and beyond)
- ✓ One beneficiary mobilising a group of other HEIs
- Independent funding scheme from EMJM (independent calls for proposals)



### Expected outcomes of an EMDM (1)

#### The jointly designed master should:

- ✓ Offer a fully integrated curriculum delivered by a consortium (involving at least three HEIs from three different countries, of which at least two must be EU Member States or third countries associated to the Programme)
- Aim at attracting excellent students worldwide
- Include physical mobility for all recruited students
- Lead to either a Joint degree or multiple degrees



### Expected outcomes of an EMDM (2)

Joint mechanisms to be included in the design of the master programme:

- ✓ Joint programme design and joint procedures
- ✓ Joint administrative and financial management
- Common services offered to students
- ✓ Joint **promotion** and **dissemination**
- A draft joint Partnership and Student Agreement
- A joint degree policy and launch of accreditation process
- + explore opportunities offered by the European Approach for Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes (if national legislation allows)



### **EMDM Set-up**

- One beneficiary mobilising a group of other HEIs (mono-beneficiary grant)
- Fixed duration of 15 months
- EU Grant: fixed lump sum contribution of 55.000 Euros (for costs linked to the activities necessary to set up the new joint master programme)
