### The 2025 Call for Proposals at a glance

Scope: to support the gradual establishment and development of international collaborative networks of Vocational Excellence – EQF levels: Can be at any EQF level but must include levels 3, 4 or 5

- **Duration of projects:** 48 months
- □ Total budget 2025: EUR 60 million
- □ Total budget 2021-2027: EUR 400 million
- □ Maximum grant per project: EUR 4 million
- □ **Type of grants:** Lump Sum Type II (payment of fixed amounts linked to the delivery of work packages)



❑ Seal of excellence for proposals scored as high quality (≥75/100 points) but cannot be funded due to insufficient funds







Minimum score to be considered for funding : 75/100 (previously 70/100). Thresholds per individual criterion do not change.

- The rules on participation of third countries not associated to the Programme have changed: :
  - Organisations from third countries not associated to the Programme from Regions 1 to 3 may participate as beneficiary, affiliated entity or associated partner. Organisations from other third countries not associated to the Programme may only participate as associated partners.

# **Eligibility Criteria (2)**

### Who can participate?

✓ Legal entities (public or private bodies)



- Established in an EU Member State or a third country associated to the Programme.
- Organisations from third countries not associated to the Programme:
  - *from Region 1 to 3 :* can also participate but not as coordinators.
  - *from other Regions:* can only participate as associated partner (with their own funds)



# **Eligibility Criteria (3)**

### What types of organisation can participate?

Any public or private organisation active in VET or in the world of work can be involved as beneficiary, affiliated entity or associated partner

### Non-exhaustive list

- VET Providers
- Companies, industry or sector representative organisations
- National/regional qualification authorities
- Research institutes
- Innovation agencies
- Regional development authorities

# Which countries can participate as full beneficiaries?



Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Republic of North Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey

> Western Balkans Neighbourhood East South-Mediterranean countries

## **Eligibility Criteria (5)**

### Which countries can participate as "associated" partners ? (with own funds)

EU Member States Third countries associated to the Programme Third countries not associated to the Programme



### **Eligibility Criteria (6)**

What should be the consortium composition?



**Each** EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme must involve:

at least 1 enterprise, industry, other employers or sector representative organisation



at least 1 VET provider at secondary and/or tertiary level)

The partnership can also include any other organisation active in VET and the world of work



The **coordinator** must be from an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme



## **Eligibility Criteria - Activities (7)**

#### For example:

- Labour market relevant skills
- Developing vet curricula and qualifications
- Innovative learner-centred approaches
- Professional development of teachers and trainers
- Quality assurance mechanisms
- Feedback loops and graduate tracking systems
- Guidance services...

### For example:

- Vet governance
- Skills development and governance
- Skills ecosystems
- Sustainable financial models
- National and EU financial instruments...

Teaching and learning (At least 4 activities)

> Governance and funding (At least 2 activities)

Cooperation and partnerships (At least 3 activities)

- Business-education
  partnerships
- Research and innovation
- Vet internationalisation and mobility
- Vet attractiveness
- Skills competitions...

### Minimum total score: 75 points

Relevance (max 35 points)

Quality of project design (25 points)

Quality of partnership (max 20 points)

Impact (max 20 points)

- 1. Express clearly your intention to develop a network of Centres of Vocational Excellence and the means to achieve this.
- 2. Provide a clear description of the partnership and the complementarity between organisations. If associated partners are listed, explain what is their role in the project.
- **3.** Describe the specific experience and competences of staff, in particular those needed for the project.
- 4. If you include an organisation from a third country not associated to the Programme from Region 1 to3 (as a full partner), explain clearly what is the value added to the project.





- 5. Provide concrete evidence of innovation and the contribution to regional development.
- 6. Be concrete in the description of your objectives and activities. Make sure that they are closely linked.
- 7. Include an independent external assessment at mid-term and at the end.
- 8. Define quality control measures for all phases.
- 9. Describe Impact in terms of changes in knowledge, behaviour or skills, policies, with concrete indicators.
- 10. For resubmitted proposals, improve the proposal according to the comments on the assessment
