Admissibility Criteria (Lot 1 and Lot 2)

- ✓Applications must be submitted no later than the deadline as indicated in the call.
- The applications must be readable and accessible
- Applications must be complete containing all parts and mandatory annexes.
- Only clerical errors can be corrected after the submission deadline upon request of the Agency

What is the role of participating organisations*

- Applicants (coordinator and full partners) (compulsory) 1 participating organisation submits the project proposal on behalf of all other partners
- Full partners (compulsory) participating organisations which contribute actively to the accomplishment of the Innovation Alliance.
- Affiliated entities (optional): organisations which contribute to the achievement of project objectives and activities. They are <u>not</u> counted for the minimum number of partners and partnership composition. They are receiving a grant and are listed in the financial table (budget).
- Associated partners (optional): organisations which contribute to the activities of the Innovation Alliance. They are <u>not</u> counted for the minimum number of partners and partnership composition. They are not receiving a grant and are not listed in the financial table (budget).

Erasmus Charter for Higher Education

About the Charter

The Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE) provides the general quality framework for European and international cooperation activities a higher education institution may carry out within Erasmus+.

The award of an ECHE is a pre-requisite for all higher education institutions located in a programme country and willing to participate in learning mobility of individuals and/or cooperation for innovation and good practices under Erasmus+.

For higher education institutions located in Partner countries, the ECHE is not required and the quality framework will be established through inter-institutional agreements between higher education institutions.

How is ECHE awarded?

A call for proposals for the award of an ECHE is held on yearly basis.

You can download the latest list of higher education institutions holding an ECHE.

The ECHE is awarded for the full duration of the Erasmus+ programme up to 2027, with an extended validity date for those projects that start in the final year of the Programme, and may last up to three years (e.g. up to 2030).

Award criteria

Equal quality of applications

The ex aequo proposals within the <u>same topic</u> will be prioritised according to the scores they have been awarded for the award criterion "**Relevance**" and then "**Impact**".

2) Quality of the project design and implementation

- Coherence: Consistency between activities and results
- Structure: Quality of the work programme (and its phasing)
- Methodology: use of the EU tools and skills when relevant
- Management
- Work Plan
- Quality of arrangements for the recognition and validation of qualifications
- Budget: Cost-effectiveness and allocation of appropriate resources
- Financial and Quality control: measures to ensure that the project implementation is of high quality





3) Quality of the partnership and the cooperation arrangements

- Configuration: composition in line with objectives
- Commitment: complementary contributions
- Involvement of Third Countries not associated to the Programme
