What is the role of participating organisations

- **Applicant** (compulsory) a participating organisation that submits the project proposal on behalf of all the partners
- Full partners (compulsory) participating organisations which contribute actively to the accomplishment of the Innovation Alliance
- Affiliated entities (optional): organisations which contribute to the achievement of project objectives and activities. They are <u>not</u> counted for the minimum number of partners and partnership composition. They are receiving a grant and are listed in the financial table (budget)
- **Associated partners** (optional): organisations which contribute to the activities of the Innovation Alliance. They are <u>not</u> counted for the minimum number of partners and partnership composition. *They are not receiving a grant and*
- are not listed in the financial table (budget)






Number and profile of participating organisations LOT 1 (minimum requirements)

Admissibility Criteria



- √The applications must be readable and accessible.
- ✓ Applications must be complete containing all parts and mandatory annexes.
- ✓Only clerical errors can be corrected after the submission deadline upon request of the Agency



Exclusion criteria

Exclusion situations linked to legal issues

Fields to tick in application form + declaration on honour if selected





Selection criteria

See part C of Programme Guide

OPERATIONAL CAPACITY

Appropriate professional competencies and qualifications

Insert in **Part B of application form**:

- Description of relevant skills and experience of project staff (no CVs)
- List of previous and running projects

FINANCIAL CAPACITY

Stable and sufficient sources of funding

Provide **upon request** and upload in Funding and Tender Opportunities portal:

- Profit and loss account
- Balance sheet
- Other documents if requested

Does not apply to public organisations



TIPS

- Do not wait until the last hour/day to submit your application
- Make sure you read all parts of the Programme guide
- Make sure you apply under the correct Call ID (Lot 1 ID ≠ Lot 2 ID)
- Make sure you include the right number and profile of participating organisations

Award criteria

Criteria	Maximum points	Minimum pass points
Relevance of the project	25	13
Quality of project design and implementation	30	16
Quality of project consortium and cooperation arrangements	25	13
Impact	20	11

Total score: Maximum 100 points

To be considered for funding:

- 1. Minimum total score 70 points AND
 - 2. Minimum pass points

Equal quality of applications

The ex aequo proposals within the <u>same topic</u> will be prioritised according to the scores they have been awarded for the award criterion "Relevance" and then "Impact"

At equal quality, a proposal covering an ecosystem or part of an ecosystem that is not covered by an ongoing Blueprint Alliance will be more relevant

Example – Lot 1

Link to EU policy and initiatives: the proposal takes into account and contributes to

achieving the European objectives in the fields of VET and higher education; the proposal takes into account and contributes to giving visibility to existing EU tools and initiatives for skills development; Purpose: the proposal is relevant to the objectives and activities of the Action; Consistency: the objectives are based on a sound needs analysis; they are clearly defined, realistic and address issues relevant to the participating organisations and to the Action; Innovation: the proposal considers state-of-the-art methods and techniques, and leads to

project-specific innovative results and solutions:

- (maximum score 25 points)
- European added value: the proposal demonstrates clearly the added value generated through its trans-nationality and potential transferability;
 Education & training representation: the Alliance includes partners that adequately
- represent education & training providers;
- Digital skills: extent to which the proposal integrates digital skills in the training content for one, or several related occupational profiles;
- Green skills: the proposal integrates skills linked to the transition to a circular and greener economy in the training content for one, or several related occupational profiles;
- Resilience skills: extent to which the proposal integrates skills linked to the capacity to adapt, manage change, and care for each other as a community.

Only Lot 2:

*Digital skills and key-enabling technologies (KETs), including Artificial Intelligence (AI) skills

*Sector/area representation



*Both levels EQF 3-5 and 6-8




