European Strategy for Universities: 4 objectives

Strengthen the European dimension in higher education and research

Bringing transnational cooperation to a higher level contributes to a culture of excellence and inclusion, a true European identity, and global competitiveness and attractiveness

Consolidate universities as lighthouses of our European way of life

Strengthen quality and relevance for future-proof skills

In a fast changing environment, universities need to strengthen their capacities to equip young people, lifelong learners and researchers with the right competences and skills Foster diversity, Promote inclusiveness and Europea gender equality values

Promote and protect European democratic values

Jniversities need to be places of freedom: for speech, thought, earning, research

Empower universities as key actors of change in the twin green and digital transitions

Develop skills, competences and technological innovation for the green and digital transition

Universities are key actors for the green transition and for a more sustainable world. We need to make 'connected universities' a reality

Reinforce universities as drivers of Europe's global role and leadership

European Commission

Expand to 60 European Universities with more than 500 universities by mid-2024,

with an Erasmus+ indicative budget totalling EUR 1.1 billion for 2021-2027. Work towards a **legal statute for alliances** of higher education institutions: pilot as of 2022 under Erasmus+ the implementation of existing European instruments

Examine options and necessary steps towards a **joint European degree**: pilot as of 2022 under Erasmus+ the first steps towards a joint European degree, in particular the development of European criteria for the award of a European Degree label



Scale up the European Student Card initiative by starting deploying a unique European Student Identifier to all mobile students in 2022 and to all students in universities in Europe by mid-2024



What is Erasmus+?



- The EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport
- Funding for programmes, projects and scholarships
- Fosters EU-EU and EU-international cooperation
- Erasmus+ 2021-2027:
 - builds on previous programme 2014-2020
 - more international

First partial call in 2021. Call 2022 currently open





Erasmus+ funding 2021-2027

- EUR 23.4 billion for Erasmus+ (2014-2020: EUR 14.7 billion)
- +60%!
- Mix of funding from internal and external funding instruments (budget headings).
- Additional funding for international actions (including Erasmus Mundus): + EUR 2.2 billion

- Institutions from **all over the world** may submit a proposal on behalf of an international consortium
- New terminology

- New funding mechanism incentives to sustainability
- Erasmus Mundus Deign Measures (EMDM): New sub-action, supporting the design of high-level study programmes at master level; € 55k lump-sum

Capacity building for higher education

- 2-3 year Partnerships of HEIs from EU MS & associated third countries and nonassociated third countries.
- Lump sums
- Three types of project
 - FOSTERING ACCESS TO COOPERATION IN HE (24-36 months):
 - > smaller scope projects focused on universities & LDCs priority to newcomers €200-400k
 - **PARTNERSHIPS FOR INNOVATION IN HE** (24-36 months):
 - For the second seco
 - STRUCTURAL REFORM PROJECTS (36-48 months)
 - Focus on policy reforms require involvement of ministries € 800-1000k



Closer alignment of European international cooperation actions with the EU priorities

Overarching priorities

- Smart: digital technology in the poorest countries by building foundations for digital skills, digital transformation and data technologies
- **Green deal:** including climate change, environment and energy; enabling a profound change in institutions and peoples' behaviour and skills.
- **Growth & Jobs:** foundational skills, 'soft' skills (e.g. problem solving, communication), and Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Maths (STEAM). Education and employability
- Inclusion and diversity: making education systems themselves more equitable.
- Values: laying the foundations for strengthening active citizenship and building specific expertise of future policymakers in areas such as democracy, human rights and multilateralism
- **External policy priorities:** governance, peace and security, migration partnerships, SDGs
