Virtual Exchanges in higher education and youth

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Executive Agency (EACEA)

What are 'virtual exchanges'?

Online people-to-people activities that promote intercultural dialogue and soft skills development. They make it possible for every young person to access high-quality international and cross-cultural education without physical mobility.

They take place in **small groups** and are always **moderated by a trained facilitator.**

They should be **easily integrated into youth (non-formal education) projects or higher education courses** – involve participants from either only one or from both sectors.

Participant organisations must arrange virtual exchanges for people in the 13-30 age range.

Western Balkans (Region 1)	€ 1 000 000
Neighbourhood East (Region 2)	€ 1 830 870
South-Mediterranean countries (Region 3)	€ 1 872 484

KPIs – Listing number of participants

Remember our funding rule: Max EU grant per project: 500 000 € (with 200 € as maximum investment per participant, i.e. a project of 500 000 € would have to reach at least 2 500 participants)

- The number of participants (young people + trained facilitators) will need to be clearly indicated in the KPI section
- There is a dedicated section of the KPIs for virtual exchanges projects



Important Reminders

Who can apply as coordinator?

Youth organisation or Higher education institution



Established in EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme

(i.e. Iceland, Norway, Liechtenstein, North Macedonia, Serbia and Türkiye)

Consortium composition

Minimum 4 independent entities (beneficiaries, not affiliated entities) from 4 different eligible countries, of which:

Minimum of 2 higher education institutions or youth organisations from 2 EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme

and

Minimum of 2 higher education institutions or youth organisations from 2 eligible third countries not associated to the Programme belonging to the same eligible region

The number of organisations from EU Member States and third countries associated to the Programme may not be higher than

the number of organisations from third countries not associated to the Programme

Affiliated entities and associated partners do not count towards the minimum eligibility criteria for the consortium composition.

Don't Forget

- ✓ Check eligibility rules in the programme guide
- ✓ Remember the funding rule (200 € as maximum investment per participant)
- ✓ Strong needs analyis helps to create focused proposals
- ✓ Good description of the virtual exchanges
- ✓ Don not wait for the last moment to submit
