Specific objectives

- To promote inclusive learning mobility opportunities
- To increase the employability of higher education students and trainees and their entrepreneurial skills
- To improve the quality, relevance, internationalisation of higher education in • Africa
- To reinforce focus on climate change mitigation and adaptation in higher education









2 CALLS FOR PROPOSALS in 2023-2024

Indicative overall budget: EUR 55 mln 1st CALL for proposals (end of March/beg April 2023): 27 mln • 2nd CALL for proposals (end 2024/beg 2025): 28 mln

CALL FOR PROPOSALS 2023 – main features

- Open to all themes/subject areas
- ✓ Expected \approx 40% of selected projects in the field of climate change, including climate change mitigation and adaptation
- Involvement of countries and HEIs which are new or have limited experience in the action





CONSORTIUM REQUIREMENTS

Applicants (beneficiaries):

Higher Education Institutions (Master/PhD level) established in Africa or in the 27 EU Member State

Lead applicants (coordinators): HEIs established in Africa

Consortium composition: 4 to 6 HEIs from Africa + one HEI from a EU Member State

✓ Geographical coverage:

- **Sub-regional projects:** African HEIs from same African region and 4 different countries <u>**Cross-regional projects</u>:** African HEIs from at least 3 African regions and 4 different</u>
- countries

SCHOLARSHIPS

<u>Indicative targets will be set in the Call for proposals:</u>

- Percentage of mobility per mobility type
- > Min-max duration per mobility type

- > Participation of women, scholarship holders with vulnerable status or special needs > Balanced distribution of mobility per host institutions and per nationality > Percentage *credit seeking* mobility (for students)

The assessment of the project proposals against the award criteria is carried out by and internal Evaluation Committee assisted by independent outside experts



Who can apply?

Students (at Master's and Doctoral level) and staff (administrative and academic) who are nationals and resident in an African country.

How do you apply?

To apply for a scholarship under the Intra-Africa academic mobility scheme (BIT+++) you should address your application directly to one of the selected partnerships.

1. Consult the list.

2. Visit the website of the partnership you are interested in to:

see which courses are available in which disciplines;
check scholarship application dates and conditions.



3. Apply directly to the partnership via its website.

If you are registered at one of the partner institutions, you may also contact your International Office.






