

Purpose of this priority: Cooperation between companies

Proposals should....

 either set out how the project will identify, test, develop or assess tools or structures focused on brokering and building this cooperation

 or lay the ground for largescale skills partnerships in industrial ecosystems under the Pact



Duration and funding

- 24 months
- Start on:
 - November 2022 or
 December 2022 or
 January 2023

- Max. grant € 700,000
- 7 projects
